The Art of Being Seen Part 2

I can't believe we are already at the last month of another year; let's look at some things we were able to cover about being seen and being safe. As we are going about our riding around town and even the country we learned that people are just wrapped up in their own world of work, play and **Facebook**. This unfortunately with today's technology of having internet on cell phones and everyone rushing to places while eating, drinking, putting on makeup and shaving to save time creates problems of distracted driving. Distracted driving is one of the leading causes of accidents along with speed and vision impairment on the roadways. For us on our motorcycles it has created a situation where we



have to take more precautions and try more and more to stand out in the vast wasteland of distraction and other vehicles around us. Let's look at a few of the things we learned this year that can help us stand out in a crowd.

Use your lights

Both decorative, colored lights and/or modulation headlights can give us more noticeability in the day or night.

Use your radio

We do not have the loud pipes as some other bikes have but we do have kick butt stereo systems that can be used to help us be heard. Just think of a foggy day and music coming out of the fog, won't that get your attention.

Move within your lane to the best spot for others to notice you

Sometimes you need to be in the left track, middle or right track. Sometimes where you should ride will depend on the situations around you. Do you need to be farther away from a car that is weaving back and forth because of a tired, drunk, or distracted driver? Do you need to be out of the blind spot of a car or truck so when they look to move from lane to lane they can see you? All of this is fluent and changes from moment to moment or situation to situation.

These are just a few of the things we learned this year get ready for a fantastic 2018 of safe riding.

Are You Ready to Ride

This is a question only you know the answer to, how much experience do you have? Ask yourself are you a beginner or an expert; I think expert is a pretty strong word to use for riding a motorcycle because we should all try and sharpen our skills all the time and educate ourselves.



Let's see how much you really know about riding a motorcycle. When riding do you have a strategy? Do you scan the road far enough ahead and have an out? Are you maintaining a safe speed, so you will be able to react to any situation ahead of you? Do you use visual control as to see what you are steering to? Do you know how to achieve maximum braking in an emergency situation and safe stopping distance? Do you have a plan for the speed your going to use when turning curves and corners? It's not just point and shoot steering and throttle. Do you understand the concept of traction management. This is very important when you need to swerve quickly. Do you understand the concept of counter weighting when riding at a low speed or in a tight turn? This technique will help you with balance and control at low speeds or when making a U-turn. Are you comfortable on your bike? Your comfort level plays a important role in you ability to handle various riding situations. When you are comfortable with your mental and physical skills you are able to react correctly in a hazardous situation. Do you know the proper way to ride with a passenger? Have you taken any training courses to improve your riding? If so are there any maneuvers still giving you trouble. Everyone should take a rider refresher course to keep their skill levels up and to be a safe rider.

Today I'm going to talk a little about riding with a passenger. When riding with a passenger there are a few things you need to keep in mind. This seems like a no brainer, but a passenger must have a seat and footrest. . . this is required by law. You should adjust your tire pressure, mirrors, and the suspension to accommodate the additional weight. Be sure your passenger has the proper safety gear, such as a DOT approved helmet, eye protection, boots, gloves, long pants, long sleeve jacket or shirt and make sure the riding jacket is highly visible. Remember, if your passenger is a child their feet must be able to touch the foot pegs in order to ride on your motorcycle. Always start the engine before the passenger gets on your bike, be sure to apply the brake when your passenger is mounting or dismounting. Your passenger should always get off the motorcycle before the operator. Keep in mind a passenger will affect the handling of your motorcycle due to the extra weight. You may also need to brake sooner and use more pressure to slow or stop. Also compensate for accelerating when passing. You will also notice a difference in handling of your motorcycle in high winds. Be sure to discuss with your passenger what to do when you are braking, turning a corner or stopping. Explain to them how they should communicate with you. To be sure you are prepared for a passenger on your bike, consider attending an Intermediate Riders Course.

Now let's look at a few safety tips in order to be a great passenger.

1. Keep your hands and feet away from hot or moving parts.
2. Hold on to the operators waist or the hand holds and keep your feet on the foot rest at all times.
3. When turning look over the operators shoulder in the direction of the turn.
4. Avoid turning around or making sudden moves.
5. Take a Basic Riders Course so you will better understand how a motorcycle operates and what to do and not to do.

I know you're thinking "No, I'm not planning on riding in the winter," but the winter months are the perfect time to think about the areas where you could use improvements. Plan to attend training classes that are going to help sharpen your skills.

Remember to Ride Safe and Be Aware.






2017 Clarksville Veteran's Day Parade




2017 Smyrna Christmas Parade



Pork Chop Special

Ingredients:

- | | |
|---------------------------------------|--------------------------------------|
| 2 (½ inch thick) pork chops | 1/8 tsp. pepper |
| 1 tablespoon flour | 1/3 cup chopped onions |
| 1 tablespoon vegetable oil | 2 c. thinly slice potatoes |
| 2 ½ tablespoon grated parmesan cheese | 2 beef bouillon cubes |
| ¼ tablespoon salt | ¼ c. plus 2 tablespoons of hot water |
| 1 ½ tsp. lemon juice | |



Directions:

Dredge pork chops in flour; brown in hot oil in a medium skillet [electric skillet works good]. Combine cheese, salt and pepper and sprinkle 1 tablespoon of mixture over pork chops. Arrange potatoes over meat and sprinkle 1 tablespoon of cheese mixture over potatoes. Arrange 1/3 cup chopped onions on top. Dissolve bouillon cubes in hot water and stir in lemon juice then pour over onions. Sprinkle remaining cheese mixture on top. Cover and simmer 40 minutes.

Makes two servings.


