THE "E" MAC'S

The Two Most Dangerous Parts of Winter

There are 2 things that winter brings that no matter how hard you try to make yourself be noticed there is no way to avoid.

The first has to do with snow or ice storms. Snow and or ice collect on the top of cars and tractor trailers during a bad storm. As it warms up the snow and ice begins to melt and flies off vehicles and tractor trailers and can hit your bike or car. This can cause damage to your car or bike or cause you to have to make a hard swerve to miss ice in the middle of the road. While there is nothing we can do about this we must be careful especially when it's nice and warm here but colder in adjoining states where the snow and ice



collects there but melts as they move thru Tennessee and falls off onto our roads and vehicles.

The second is an issue that I personally tested just the other morning and has to do with cold mornings and frosty windows. I went out to go to work and noticed the windows were slightly frosted with a thin coat of ice. What causes frost on cars? This is caused by moisture inside of the car which could be from wet floor mats or other surfaces inside of the car. This moisture evaporates, turns to water vapor, becomes supercooled and then forms ice on the inside of the car windows. Normally I would start the car, wait for it to warm up to melt the frost on my windows and be safely on my way with a clear view of all directions. This day I decided to jump in the car and not wait for my windows to defrost to get a better understanding of how dangerous it is to be on the road with limited visibility. It took about 2 miles for the car to warm up enough to just begin to see out and another 1/2 mile to get fully defrosted for me to have full visibility in all directions.

That being said there is no way we can make ourselves visible to flying ice or people leaving for work in the mornings that cannot see out of their car windows. The only thing we can do is be on the watch for these possible winter dangers and leave a greater distance between yourself and the cars around you. This will prepare you for other drivers that think it's safe to head to work with frost covered windows, that keeps them from being able to see what or who is in their path as they change lanes, speed up or slow down.

Be safe this winter and get ready for the warm weather to arrive.



Strategies for Street Survival

Believe it or not, Spring is just around the corner and the riding season will soon be upon us. It has been a long layoff since we had a nice road trip with our friends in Chapter E so our riding skills have probably become a little rusty. The easiest way to sharpen our riding skills is to find a safe spot in an empty parking lot and practice smooth shifting, hard braking, emergency swerving and low speed figure eights. Even co-riders should get on the bike and get some practice “seat time”. I also read an interesting article in an AMA (American Motorcyclist Association) magazine that offered 6 tips for strategies for street survival that I would like to pass on.

1. Remember to SEE. Search, Evaluate, Execute.

Don't just ride along on autopilot. Engage your brain and constantly search for potential dangers, evaluate what's happening around you and execute measures to keep yourself out of trouble.

2. Traffic Positioning.

Where should you position yourself on the road? It depends. When riding in a group, we learned to use lane positioning to keep in a safe position with the riders around us. When riding solo, the safest approach is to practice “traffic positioning”. Basically, keep the biggest cushion you can between you and cars, trucks, walls or anything else that can harm you. Road conditions will also dictate the safest speed and lane positions to follow.

3. Play “What if...?”

What if that car turns left in front of you? What if that semi loses a tire tread in the next lane? Playing “What if...?” keeps you mentally engaged and prepared with a plan if something does happen.

4. Look where you want to go.

It's probably the first and simplest lesson we learned when we started riding motorcycles. But it's also the most essential. In a panic situation, you should automatically look to where you want to go. Your wing will go there...So don't fixate on that car in front of you or a spot 25 feet down the road, look at the clear path that leads you safely out of trouble.

5. Practice.

I know I've covered this already but it is important. Not only will you knock some of the rust off, you can learn to know your limits. Find out what your limits are by practicing instead of getting in over your head. Ride your own ride safely.

6. Oh say, can you see?

I never thought of this before but you can only evaluate potential hazards well if you can see them well. Get your eyes checked annually and maintain a 20/20 vision. I would also like to add that you need to feel well to be able to keep your concentration sharp and focused for safe riding. Work on keeping in shape and keep your medications up to date. I'm sure we can think of more strategies for street survival than just the 6 tips offered here. I like the premise of Strategies for Street Survival and I'm sure we can think of more to share later but in the meantime, bring on spring!

Ride Smart, Ride Safe and SEE you down the road


"2018 District "Winter Event"

Baked Macaroni and Cheese



- | | |
|--|--|
| 1 Tablespoon of butter plus (1) teaspoon | 2 cups uncooked elbow macaroni |
| 1/2 teaspoon of table salt | 2 cups of milk |
| 1/4 cup all-purpose flour | 1 teaspoon onion salt |
| 1 cup extra sharp cheddar cheese | 1 1/2 cups Monterey Jack and Cheddar Blend |
| 1/2 cup parmesan | 1/2 cup Ritz Crackers (about 12) |

Directions:

1. Place a rack in the center of oven and preheat to 350 degrees. Lightly butter a 13 x 9 baking dish with a teaspoon of butter and set aside.
2. Bring a large pot of water to a boil over high heat. Stir in the macaroni and the table salt, reduce heat to medium-high, and cook uncovered until just done, 7 to 8 minutes. Drain macaroni in a colander, shaking it to remove excess water.
3. Place the milk in a large mixing bowl and whisk in the flour and onion salt until smooth. Stir in the cheese. Add the warm macaroni to the milk mixture and stir to combine well. Spoon the macaroni mixture into the prepared baking dish, smoothing the top. Sprinkle the cracker crumbs evenly over the casserole and dot the top with the remaining 1 tablespoon of butter cut into bits.
4. Bake macaroni and cheese until it bubbles throughout and the topping is golden, 40 to 45 minutes. Serves 8
