Ready to roll. The day started off cool, but quickly warmed




Our Ride Group on Saturday





The Art of Being Seen

THE "E" MAC's

We are at the end of another year, let's look at some things we were able to cover about being seen and being safe. As we are riding around town and even the country we learned that people are just wrapped up in their own world of work, play and Facebook. This unfortunately with todays technology of internet on cell phones, and rushing to places while eating, drinking, putting on makeup and shaving to save time creates problems of distracted driving. Distracted driving is one of the leading causes of accidents along with speed and vision impairment on the roadways. For us on our motorcycles it has created a situation where we have to take more precautions and try harder to stand out in the vast wasteland of distraction and other vehicles around us. Lets look at a few of the things we learned we can do to stand out in the crowd.



Wear bight clothing

What we wear can help us be seen, a black leather jacket looks cool but cannot stand out in the eyes of folks around us. Bright safety clothes (green, orange) or other bright colors can help us stand out.

Use reflective clothing or tape

For night driving having clothes with reflective material and adding reflective tape on or around our bikes or trailers can increase us being seen by many, many feet. Reflective tape can be put on the back of your helmet which will move more than the bike to help draw even more attention to you. This will help with visibility and will draw other drivers eyes to us and help keep us safe on the road.


Buy a bright colored bike.

While this may not be feasible for everyone to run to Sloan's and trade in that \$40,000 bike for another \$40,000 bike and many folks like the color of their bike but having a brightly colored bike will definitely help you stand out. Think of the difference in a black bike and a yellow bike going down the road.

These are just a few of the things we learned this year, look for more next month and be seen be safe.

A big "Thanks to Randy, Murray, Barry, David and Mike (Randy's brother) for assisting me in laying out the Trike Rider Course just prior to the scheduled class. We got the job done in record time. Couldn't have done it without each of you!

The Rider Education Levels Program

This month I thought it would be a good time to talk about the Rider Education Levels Program since riding season is winding down. Winter is a great time to make sure your riding levels are up-to-date and taking care of anything that needs to be done to get to the next level. So let's get started:

Level 1 is "Safety by Commitment" meaning the rider and co-rider commits to riding safely, they also must submit a Rider Education Program Levels Application (N-7).

Level 2 "Safety by Education" Referred to as Tour Rider to achieve this level you must be a GWRRRA Member, current motorcycle license, be a Level 1 in the Riders Ed. Program with 5,000 safe miles, a GWRRRA approved Rider Course within the past 3 years or an approved GWRRRA Parking Lot Practice within the last year. Co-Rider Requirements: GWRRRA Member, be a Level 1 with 5,000 miles, attend a 2 up Rider Course within the past 3 years.

Level 3 "Safety by Preparedness" Referred to as Certified Tour Rider/Co-Rider you must have a Motorist Awareness Seminar, maintain current GWRRRA Medic First Aid Class (that includes first aid and CPR), carry a First Aid Kit on your bike, GWRRRA Member, Be enrolled and current in Level 2, submit an N-7 application form. This is for both Rider and Co-Rider.

Level 4 "Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness" Referred to as Master Tour Rider/ Co-Rider this is the most prestigious level within the Rider Ed Program and the highest level of commitment by the Rider and or Co- Rider towards safe riding and preparedness. Rider/Co-Rider Requirements: be a current GWRRRA Member, been a participate of level 3 for (1) full year, have ridden a minimum of 25,000 miles, be current in First Aid and CPR Certifications, and wear proper riding gear at all times, submit a completed Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider Application Form (N-9), written recommendation from the Chapter Educator.

REMEMBER to update your safe miles, which can be reported in 5,000 mile increments. This can be done by contacting Walter and completing a N-7 form.

Chapter E Rider Education Achievements



The Rider Education Levels Program is alive in Chapter E with the following members committing or moving up in the Levels Program. Eddie Jones received her Co-Rider Level 1 Patch, Nancy Broadway received her Co-Rider Level 3 Patch, and Geraldine Jones received her Co-Rider Level 2 and 3 Patches. We encourage all Chapter E Members to participate in the Rider Education Levels Program.

Congratulations to Mac McGlothlin and Art Seeley in completing the GWRRRA Trike Rider Course on October 7. The course allowed Mac to maintain his Grand Master Tour Rider status and Art to initially complete a Rider Education course on his way to upgrade in the levels program.

Remember to Ride Safe and Be Aware.

Georgia Pecan Pie

Ingredients:

3 Large eggs

1 cup of sugar

3 tablespoons butter, melted and cooled

1 store-bought 9 inch piecrust, unbaked

1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

1 cup dark corn syrup

1.5 cups coarsely chopped pecans or pecan halves



Directions:

1. Place a rack in center of oven and preheat to 350 degrees
2. Place eggs in a bowl and whisk lightly. Add sugar, corn syrup, vanilla, butter and stir with a wooden spoon to combine. Stir in the pecans. Pour the filling into the unbaked pie crust.
3. Bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, 50 to 52 minutes. Place on a wire rack and cool completely before serving about 1 hour, Serves 8.




