Fall has finally arrived, what a long hot summer we had. On Friday, October 10 it was 91 degrees in Ft. Myers Beach Florida and when we got home Saturday it was 56 degrees. Wow talk about a culture shock, we definitely noticed the dropped in temperature.

Did you know that the change in temperature can effect the tire pressure in your motorcycle tires? As the temperature falls so does the pressure in your tires. For every 10 degree drop in temperature your tire pressure lowers by one to two pounds. When the temperature is high , the air in your tires takes up more space, whereas when the temperature is cold, the air takes up less space. When we returned I checked my air pressure and had to add 8 pounds of air to my tires. With this being said we all need to be

aware of our tire pressure. This is a safety check that is very important and can help keep us all safe and enjoy a comfortable ride.

As most of you know our son Walter II purchased a motorcycle this year. We had planned to ride down but since there was such a high chance of rain we trailed our bikes. LW (Little Walter) and I got to do some riding together and spend some father and son time together. I really enjoyed sharing my love of motorcycle riding with him and doing something we both love to do. LW and Kristen also went on a ride together, they took a trip from Ft. Myers to Key West. They stayed overnight and enjoyed having some quality time just the two of them. Kristen was a little leery about riding on a motorcycle that far, since she had never been on a motorcycle until they purchased one in March of this year but she really had a great time. Of course Barbara and I were excited to have Lyndley all to our selves. We took her to the Science Museum one of the days and rode bicycles up and down the strip the next. 



We need to spread the word about the type association we are and what our principles are. Chapter Directors, you can call National and request posters handle bar hangers and other types of material for recruiting. When you get the materials put them out and make sure folks will know how to get ahold of you if they are interested in joining. You don't have to restrict yourself to putting up posters and material at the Honda Shops. All brands are welcome so include other motor cycle shops also. Let's make this a year to spread the word and go outside of our organization and make some new friends and riding partners.

Candy Corn Pinwheel Cookies

Ingredients

2 cups flour	1 teaspoon baking soda
1 cup butter, softened	1 cup sugar
1 pkg. (3.3 oz.) JELL-O White Chocolate Flavor Instant Pudding	
1 egg	1/4 tsp. each orange and yellow food coloring
2 Tbsp. white sparkling decorating sugar	

Directions

1. Combine flour and baking soda. Beat next 4 ingredients in large bowl with mixer until blended. Gradually add flour mixture, mixing well after each addition. Divide dough into 3 equal portions.
2. Place 1 portion of dough in medium bowl; tint with orange food coloring. Wrap in plastic wrap. Repeat in separate bowl with second portion of dough and yellow food coloring. Wrap remaining (untinted) dough with plastic wrap. Refrigerate all doughs for 1 hour.
3. Roll out uncolored dough between 2 lightly floured sheets of waxed paper into a 10x17-inch rectangle. Repeat with orange dough; place over uncolored dough rectangle. Repeat with yellow dough, stacking on top of orange dough. Starting at 1 long side of rectangle, roll up dough tightly into log. Wrap in plastic wrap. Freeze for 1 hour.
4. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Unwrap dough; cut into 34 slices, each about 1/4 inch thick. Place 2 inches apart on parchment-covered baking sheets. Sprinkle with decorating sugar.
5. Bake 10 to 12 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Cool on baking sheets 2 minutes. Remove to wire racks; cool completely.


